Electronic Transmission Absentee Ballot Application Instructions

- This application can only be used when applying for an electronically transmitted absentee ballot for the November 8, 2016 General Election.
- By law, applications requesting an electronic transmission ballot may be submitted beginning on October 24, 2016. **Applications submitted prior to October 24, 2016 will be denied**
- Completed applications must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. Alaska Standard Time on November 7, 2016.
- Upon receipt of your completed application, your faxed ballot packet or email notification for availability of your online delivery ballot will be sent within 24 to 48 hours.
- To request an electronic transmission ballot, you must be a qualified registered voter 30 days prior to Election Day except in U.S. presidential elections. In a presidential election, you may initially register to vote and participate in the presidential race. To register to vote, and participate in the presidential election, you must complete a voter registration application and submit it along with this electronic transmission application and any supporting documentation no later than 5:00 p.m. Alaska Standard Time on November 7, 2016. You may locate the voter registration application on our web page at elections.alaska.gov.

Box 1	Provide your current name (Last, First, Etc.).												
Box 2	If you are registered under a different name, provide your former name.												
Box 3	<p>Alaska residence address: Provide a physical residence address in Alaska. Your application will be denied if you do not provide a residence address or you provide a mailing address such as a PO Box, HC Number and Box, PSC Box, Rural Route Number, Commercial Address, Mail Stop Address or an address outside of Alaska. If your residence has been assigned a street name and house number, provide this information or indicate exactly where you live such as, highway name and milepost number, boat harbor with pier and slip number, subdivision name with lot and block, or trailer park name and space number. If you live in rural Alaska, provide the community name as your residence address.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If you are temporarily out of state and have intent to return, you may maintain your Alaska residence as it appears on your current record. If you provide a new residence address, it must be within Alaska. Active military members and spouses are exempt from the intent to return requirement. 												
Box 4	Provide your current permanent mailing address.												
Box 5	You must provide an identifier. If you do not provide an identifier, your application will be denied. When requesting an online delivery ballot, please provide the last four of your SSN and date of birth. You will need to use your date of birth and last four of your SSN to log into the online delivery system.												
Box 6	<p>Indicate the method that you would like your ballot delivered:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Online Delivery: When voting by online delivery, you MUST provide your email address. You will receive an email notification of ballot availability to the email address you provide. Please check your spam/junk mail based upon your email filters for your email notification if it is not received in your inbox. When voting by online delivery, you will need access to a computer, printer and, if returning your voted ballot by online delivery, have equipment (such as a scanner) to produce a digital file (PDF, TIFF or JPEG) of your completed Voter Certificate and Identification sheet. • Fax Delivery: When voting by fax, you MUST provide a fax number. When having your ballot faxed to a domestic fax, provide your area code and fax number and, when requesting your faxed ballot from outside the United States, provide your international number, country code and fax number. 												
Box 7	Provide contact information so the division can contact you if we need additional information to accept your application.												
Box 8	Military and overseas voters, select the option that best describes you.
