John Bayard Anderson was born on February 15, 1922, in Rockford, Illinois. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa in Political Science from the University of Illinois, received four battle stars in the United States Army, and received his law degree from the University of Illinois in 1946. In 1949, he received his LLM degree from Harvard University Law School. He practiced law in Rockford for two years and then served as a foreign service officer for the United States overseas until 1955 when he returned to private law practice in Rockford.

He won election as State's Attorney in 1956, and three years later, decided to run for Congress. The campaign was successful — in 1978, he was re-elected to his tenth term as a congressman from Illinois.

John Anderson married the former Keke Machakos of Boston, Massachusetts in 1953. They have five children, and maintain homes in Washington, DC and Rockford, Illinois.

STATEMENT

John Anderson's early Congressional career manifested a conservative ideology. But he became increasingly disturbed by the social upheavals of the late 1960s and broke from the conservative mainstream, most dramatically by casting the vote which broke the deadlocked Rules Committee and reported out the Open Housing Bill of 1968. Many veteran Capitol Hill observers credited the Congressman's inspiring speech with turning sentiment in favor of the legislation.

During the 1970s, Congressman Anderson has boldly represented the ideas and principles of social reform, fiscal responsibility, human rights, and national unity. This unique blend of social compassion and fiscal responsibility is characterized by his support for the Equal Rights Amendment, campaign financing reform, and Open Housing incentives, while simultaneously

recognizing the need for a vital economy and its important effect upon American society.

As a leading spokesman on energy, he called for an energy conservation tax on all motor fuels to cut consumption and reduce our dependence on foreign supplies. In order to reduce the burden on those with special needs, his plan provided that revenues from the tax would be used to reduce employee Social Security taxes, increase Social Security benefits, and allow tax credits for businesses unfairly penalized. He supports the accelerated development of a synthetic fuels industry and the maintenance of strict safeguards on the further use of nuclear power. He advocates a balanced budget for 1981, and is chief sponsor of the Regulatory Reform Act of 1979, which would benefit both business and consumers.

STATEMENT

A Message from Ed Clark to each Alaskan Voter

I have visited Alaska several times during this campaign because I believe that the vote of each Alaskan is important not only to my campaign, but to the nation as a whole.

My candidacy represents the principles of individual freedom which would allow each Alaskan to determine what is best for his or her own life. Ronald Reagan was born in 1911 in Illinois. He graduated from Eureka College, served in the Army Air Corps during WWII, and in 1952 married the former Nancy Davis. During Reagan's motion picture/television career, he appeared in fifty films and became a production supervisor and television host.

Reagan was elected Governor of California in 1966 with a margin of nearly a million votes. Re-elected in 1970, Reagan became Chairman of the Republican Governors' Association.

Although he narrowly lost the 1976 presidential nomination, he campaigned vigorously for the Republican ticket. In 1978, he campaigned for over 85 candidates for state and federal office.

Awards include: National Humanitarian Award, National Conference of Christians and Jews; City of Hope "Torch of Life" Award; Horatio Alger Award; American Newspaper Guild Award; Distinguished American Award, National Football Foundation Hall of Fame; American Patriots Hall of Fame; Medal of Valor of the State of Israel.

STATEMENT

Many of our leaders seem resigned to a dismal future of stagnation and sacrifice. They seem convinced we must learn to "live with less" — fewer jobs, less energy, a lower standard of living, and declining world respect. Indeed, the only thing they promise more of is inflation and federal intrusion on states and localities. I reject this despairing notion, and propose instead that we make a bold commitment to economic growth and international strength.



STATEMENT

Frank Murkowski, as United States Senator, will place progressive and environmentally sound economic development for the State of Alaska as his top priority. He believes his program will ensure a stable economy, provide jobs for Alaskans, and protect Alaska's future.

STATEMENT

Elected to Congress March 7, 1973, Don Young was appointed to the two major committees that affect Alaska most — Interior and Merchant Marine and Fisheries.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS — Upon arrival in Congress, Don Young sponsored and led the fight for authorization of the oil pipeline. That battle was won in August, 1973. Next, Don sponsored and spearheaded the 200-mile fishing limit legislation. That effort was also successful.
