

Here's another choice: The young people of our country should have the choice of dedicating two years of their lives in the Armed Services or to other forms of public service mainly within our own borders, much like the old Peace Corps.

And here's another choice: Every adult worker would be asked to switch to a four-day workweek. The free market system will quickly balance the workdays lost with the idle days of the unemployed.

### STATEMENT

Elected to Congress March 7, 1973, Don Young was appointed to the two major committees that affect Alaska most—Interior and Merchant Marine and Fisheries.

**ACCOMPLISHMENTS**—Upon arrival in Congress, Don Young sponsored and led the fight for authorization of the oil pipeline. That battle was won in August 1973. Next, Don sponsored and spearheaded the 200-mile fishing limit legislation. That effort was also successful.

On the Alaska National Interest Lands legislation, Don battled for Alaska's position through four years of debate. This delayed enactment until Ronald Reagan's election after which a more favorable piece of legislation was passed.

There have been many other important issues Don has successfully worked on including: tax and IRS reforms, foreign processors, senior citizen assistance,

hydroelectric projects and many more.

**SENIORITY**—During his five terms in Congress, Don has risen dramatically in seniority and influence. He is now ranking member on two major subcommittees—Parks and Public Lands and Coast Guard. His other committee assignments include Mining, Fish and Wildlife, and Outer Continental Shelf. Don has reached a senior position on both his committees and if control of the House changed, he would be in position for Chairmanship of the Interior Committee.

**SERVICE**—In addition to passing other legislation such as OCS impact aid, airport development, harbors, etc., Congressman Young also responded to over 200,000 requests from Alaskans regarding help with the federal bureaucracy.



## STATEMENT

Alaska's entire Permanent Fund, approaching four billion dollars, is invested outside the State. I have advocated from the beginning that this money should be invested in Alaska's home mortgage market, allowing residents to buy or refinance their homes at a rate of eight to ten percent.

General surplus funds should be employed to construct capital improvements such as hydroelectric facilities, highways, runways, harbors, docks, bridges, recreational facilities, and all other things which Alaskans need and want. I would place but one restriction: that the community must both approve the project and commit itself to paying for operation and maintenance.

These two programs would produce thousands of long-term jobs, and would create benefits which will

endure for generations.

We should also pay off all bonded debt for the state and local governments, thereafter proceeding on a cash basis. One of our finest contributions to future Alaskans would be a debt-free society.

I also intend, as Governor, to lower the boom on criminals and people who encourage them. I am willing to spend any funds required to separate violent people from society. Hard-pressed law enforcement people will receive the support they need to do their job. Given the opportunity, I will appoint judges who understand that laws are intended to protect society, not lawbreakers. I would support capital punishment for certain atrocious crimes such as rape-murder, killing an on-duty law enforcement officer, wanton murder and terrorism.

I will stop the random growth of bureaucracy.

## STATEMENT
