


UNITED STATES PRESIDENT

RONALD REAGAN**

Ronald Wilson Reagan, born February 6, 1911, in Tampico, Illinois, graduated from Eureka College (Illinois) in 1932 with a degree in economics and sociology.

Following a brief career as a sports broadcaster and editor, Mr. Reagan began a film career which, interrupted by three years of service in the Army Air Corps during World War II, encompassed 50 feature-length motion pictures.

In 1952 he married Nancy Davis.

In 1966 Ronald Reagan began his public service career with his election -- by nearly a million-vote margin -- as Governor of California. He was re-elected in 1970.

In November 1979 Ronald Reagan announced his candidacy for the presidency. Nominated unanimously on the first ballot at the Republican National Convention, he was elected President by an electoral vote of 489-49. On January 20, 1981, Ronald Reagan was sworn in as the 40th President of the United States.

STATEMENT

Four years ago America faced the greatest challenge in our post-war history. Our nation's defenses were dangerously weak. We had suffered humiliation in Iran, and there was the sense that we had lost the respect of friend and foe alike. Our nation lacked leadership, and even our elected officials failed to trust in the courage and character of the American people.

Worst of all, years of Government overindulgence and abusive taxation had left us in the worst economic mess since the Great Depression. Americans were ready to make a new beginning.



UNITED STATES VICE PRESIDENT GEORGE BUSH Republican



George Herbert Walker Bush, born June 12, 1924, in Milton, Massachusetts, graduated from Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts in June 1942. He immediately enlisted in the U.S. Navy, and at age 18 was the youngest commissioned pilot in the Navy.

From 1942 to 1945 George Bush saw active duty as a carrier pilot in the Pacific, where he won three air medals and the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Returning home, he entered Yale University, and in 1948 graduated Phi Beta Kappa in economics. He was captain of Yale's varsity baseball team.

George Bush is currently Vice President of the United States. Prior to becoming Vice President, he served as a U.S. Representative from Texas, U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, Chairman of the Republican National Committee, Chief of the U.S. Liaison Office in the People's Republic of China and Director of the Central Intelligence Agency.

STATEMENT

Four years of President Reagan's leadership has made a big difference for America. We have a strong economic recovery, revitalized national defenses and expanding opportunity for all.

He and his wife Joan have been married since 1955 and have three children: Ted, 27; Eleanor Jane, 25; and William, 22. During his 24 years in public life, Mr. Mondale has served as Attorney General of Minnesota (1960-1964), United States Senator (1964-1977), and Vice President of the United States (1977-1981). Since 1981 he has been Of Counsel to the Chicago-based law firm of Winston & Strawn. Mr. Mondale enjoys reading, sports, and is an avid fisherman.

STATEMENT

Every generation has its own special challenge. But each generation has the same basic responsibility: to leave its children a better world than the one they inherited. We cannot go back. We cannot solve our children's problems by repeating our parents' answers.

Walter Mondale's plans for America's future:

- * Commit our nation to educational access and excellence;
- * Ensure fair treatment for every member of our workforce by vigorously enforcing anti-discrimination statutes, passing the Equal Rights Amendment, and working toward pay equity;
- * Promote science and technology by restoring a proper balance between civilian and military activities;
- * Begin full enforcement of all environmental laws and regulations, renew the attack on toxic wastes, and address ignored problems such as acid rain;
- * Commit our country to energy security, through inno-

vative technologies, new energy sources, and more conservation.

- * Promote small business with measures to reduce interest rates, foster capital formation, and increase the supply of skilled researchers and engineers;
- * Improve cooperation with our allies by abandoning divisive export control policies, renewing our support for human rights and democratic values around the world, de-escalating the rhetoric of military confrontation with the Soviet Union, and promote nuclear arms control by: (1) ratifying SALT II; (2) tightly controlling the flow of weapons-grade material; (3) re-emphasizing non-proliferation; (4) raising the nuclear threshold in Europe; (5) improving crisis communications with the Soviet Union; (6) negotiating toward a mutual and verifiable freeze on strategic arms; and (7) convening a summit conference to get the START and TNF talks back on track.

UNITED STATES VICE PRESIDENT
GERALDINE A. FERRARO
Democrat



Geraldine Ferraro was born on August 26, 1935, in Newburgh, New York. She attended Marymount School and graduated from Marymount Manhattan College in 1956. She taught in the New York public school system, putting herself through law school at night. She obtained her law degree from Fordham University School of Law in 1960. Congresswoman Ferraro was elected to the 96th Congress in 1978, winning re-election in 1980 and 1982. She is a member of the House Budget Committee which sets national spending priorities. In the 98th Congress, Representative Ferraro served a second term as Secretary of the House Democratic Caucus.

In January, 1984, Representative Ferraro was named Chair of the Democratic Platform Committee for the 1984 national convention. In addition, she was a key member of the Hunt Commission which developed delegate selection rules for the 1984 convention.

Congresswoman Ferraro and her family live in Forest Hills.

STATEMENT

Congresswoman Geraldine Ferraro has maintained a private law practice and has worked in the District Attorney's office of Queens County. While an Assistant District Attorney, Geraldine Ferraro served as chief of the Special Victims Bureau and the Confidential Unit, both of which she created. She has tried cases involving sex crimes, family violence and child abuse, as well as crimes against the elderly.

Presently as a member of the Select Committee on Aging, Representative Ferraro has concentrated on programs to combat crimes against the elderly, expand health care and provide senior centers. As a member of the executive board of the Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues, Congresswoman Ferraro has been in the forefront of efforts to achieve passage of the Economic Equity Act and the Equal Rights Amendment. She


authored sections of the Equity Act dealing with private pension reform and expanding retirement savings options for homemakers.

Representative Ferraro is serving her third term as a member of the House Committee on Public Works and Transportation. Representing a district adjacent to two of the nation's busiest airports, she has become a strong advocate for air safety and noise control. She has focused attention on the poor condition of New York's streets, bridges and water systems and has fought for mass transit funding.

Representative Ferraro is a member of the Board of Visitors of the Merchant Marine Academy. She is a member of the executive board of the Congressional Arts Caucus and the Steering Committee of the Northeast-Midwest Coalition.

Nonpartisans prefer political action based on individual responsibility, wisdom, integrity, intelligence, leadership and courage instead of blind party loyalty.

George Washington, our nation's founder, who never told a lie, warned against the danger of political parties in the state:

"Party spirit is truly the worst enemy of popular government. Party spirit serves always to enfeeble the public administration. Ill-founded jealousy; it kindles the animosity of one part against another; it foment occasionally riot and insurrection. Party spirit opens the door to corruption."

Power has evolved away from the people and into the hands of parties, politicians, and business. The Golden

Rule of Politics is: "Those who have the gold, rule". Money is the number one political problem our nation faces.

My goals are to break the stranglehold of parties and money on the political process; improve citizen access to and participation in government using modern technology; and increase legislative responsiveness.

We have a right to expect effectiveness from the instruments of self-government we must use to solve our nation's problems. We have the means of improving our institutions.

To satisfactorily resolve specific issues we must bring our governmental system back to its original democratic principles.

It's time to turn the tide.

Let it begin in Alaska, the last frontier, the land of the individual and other endangered species.
