

STATEMENT

A trial judge should make sure that persons who are involved in disputes have a place to come to where they are fairly heard and where a decision will be reached which is based on the law and which is reasonably prompt.

A fair hearing requires that each side be fully listened to and that each argument be honestly considered. A decision based on the law means that the judge must take pains to discover the correct law -- generally, as passed by the legislature, or, in certain areas, as established by the higher courts -- and then must apply it to the case at hand. A reasonably prompt decision requires that all of the cases pressing to be heard in court be managed

properly so that not every minute is devoted to trials and hearings and that some time is allotted to thoughtful decision-making.

A judge must attempt to carry out the will of the people, as expressed through the legislature, while following the will of the founders of our state and nation, as expressed in our state and federal constitutions. Sometimes a law or an action of a state official will conflict with the constitution. Although it happens infrequently, in such a case it is the duty of the judge to say so.

In the 2 years I have been a judge, I have tried my best to meet the standards set out above, with varying success. I would appreciate the opportunity to continue.














