All Alaskans must continue to pursue a course of action that creates economic opportunities for our people as well as outside investors; to develop policies, programs and projects through government restraint and cooperative spirit; and to maximize Alaskan economic advantages and reward from the management, harvesting, processing and marketing of Alaska's commonwealth resources.

In order to compete in the world marketplace, we Alaskans must continue to support education, including creative and applied research and development.

A healthy, clean and understood natural environment is a fundamental prerequisite for healthy Alaskans.

My primary concerns for District 27 remain our families, our fisheries, fairness and a positive outlook for our future. I will remain open and accessible to you. I would like to continue working for you as an honest, effective citizen-participant in our legislative process. To be a good and effective leader is, I believe, to be led by the people, for then we can all say "we have done it ourselves."
