



I've worked hard to sustain programs that benefit our people. School funding, power cost equalization,





Health, Education and Our Children — This is a critical concern of mine. Good health and education are basic, fundamental rights which should be in the reach of every Alaskan.


Helping People — The greatest reward of serving in office is helping people. As your representative, my first job is to protect the interests of District 26, and to listen and represent you.


