

of our great state. It will be my privilege to stand up and protect the rights of this special class of people.







skills in those Key Values which, seen integrated in action, define the alternative "Green" Power.


- We must shatter our stereotypes and relate person to person.




In closing, Alaska must concentrate its' money in developing its' most valuable resource: the human resource.
