




Major problems don't get solved when representation is ineffective. We are mired in crisis management and last-ditch scrambles rather than in helping build a better future.

***Root cause:** Our State budget problems must be resolved. If we had reduced the budget 5% a year from 1991 to 1994, we could have saved \$1.1 billion. We must establish the State's priorities, set realistic goals and budget accordingly.

***One consequence:** The University of Alaska lost on all issues affecting it this legislative session. Since 1984, UA's budget has too often been the means to balance the State's budget. A state that destroys its universities destroys its future. We need to address the unfinished Natural Sciences building, deferred maintenance and long-term revenue problems.

***Major contributor:** When regulations become stifling and unreasonable, businesses stagnate, institutional costs rise astronomically and citizens lose respect for the law. We need regulatory reform to return to constructive and fair guidelines that enable businesses to grow and develop, to restore school control to local communities, and to enable municipalities to do their jobs.

***A straightforward plan:** I will focus on these three major issues as the keystone pieces for building a better future. In order to move forward, Alaska must first have its financial house in order, must be in good condition to train future leaders, and must have a regulatory climate that is sensible and responsible. With these three keys in place, we can move from strength to creating a 21st century Alaska for all Alaskans.





Over the past two years I have enjoyed working for the people of Fairbanks in Juneau. 


Statement

water and sewer have been of utmost importance to bush communities. During the last six years our house district has consistently ranked, year after year, within the top 10% for appropriations to legislative districts.




