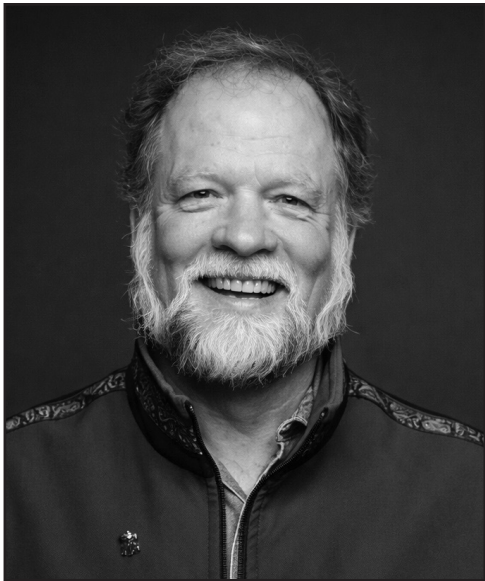

STATEMENT:
I believe that the best representation starts with talking to your constituents, asking them what they want you to focus on, and then doing that work. Since 2022 I have knocked on over 10,000 doors in HD22, North Muldoon, asking that question. Consistently I have heard that the top three issues for my neighbors are education, public safety, and transportation. Here is how I have represented these concerns in Juneau.

For education, most have said they want increased and stable funding for our schools and our students. In Juneau I voted to increase education funding, and then helped over-ride a veto of some of that funding. For those that wanted education reform I have worked to improve education by sponsoring a bill to require financial literacy education in high school, and cosponsored a bill requiring a civics education class for graduation.

For public safety and transportation I worked to fill the many vacant state and local first responder positions and in the State Department of Transportation by voting for HB78, a conservative defined benefit pension bill. This bill would help government agencies attract and retain talented employees. We need a fully staffed and functioning Alaska State Troopers, Anchorage Police and Fire Departments, and an Alaska Department of Transportation. This would improve these critical services.

Other issues I have fought for has been a bigger PFD to deal with our affordability crisis, funding early childhood and childcare needs, and creating energy solutions.
