Position Statement

We believe that Alaska possesses sufficient existing and potential revenue from its natural resources to meet the State's needs without implementing a state income tax, provided those resources are managed responsibly and efficiently.

We believe that current spending patterns are unsustainable and undermine the long-term stability of Alaska's institutions. Fiscal discipline and accountability must be restored to ensure the State's future prosperity.

We believe that the Permanent Fund Dividend (PFD) should be protected, strengthened, and preserved for future generations of Alaskans.

We believe that homelessness and vagrancy cannot be allowed to continue unabated in Alaska's urban centers. While we support providing meaningful assistance to individuals experiencing homelessness, substance abuse, and mental health challenges, we do not support policies that enable criminal behavior or perpetuate dependency.

We believe that Alaska's educators deserve strong support through adequate school funding, competitive salaries, and comprehensive benefits that attract and retain the most qualified teachers and education professionals.

We believe that lasting solutions require cooperation across political, religious, racial, and cultural lines. As demonstrated by the diverse affiliations within our coalition, we are committed to advancing Alaska's interests through unity rather than division.

We believe that Alaska's fisheries must be protected from exploitative overfishing and managed sustainably to preserve this vital resource for future generations.

We believe that government leaders must remain accessible to the people they serve. To advance this goal, we support implementing a Feedback Access Report system and a One-Page Accountability Report, providing Alaskans with clear pathways to communicate concerns
