STATEMENT:

I decided to run for State House because I was no longer willing to sit on the sidelines while decisions affecting working families, small businesses, and the future of our community were being made.

My priorities are restoring stable, predictable school funding that supports educational outcomes, manageable class sizes, and greater accountability; expanding access to affordable, reliable energy; strengthening public safety; and growing a private-sector economy where businesses can invest, innovate, and create opportunity. A healthy economy gives Alaska the capacity to invest responsibly in the schools, infrastructure, and core public services people depend on.

I believe government has an essential role in making that possible by creating the conditions where families, businesses, and communities can succeed while continually measuring whether those efforts are achieving their purpose. Government should focus on its core responsibilities and demand results in education, public safety, and a thriving private-sector economy.

My approach to leadership is grounded in stewardship, accountability, optimism, and long-term thinking. I will question assumptions, judge ideas by whether they work, and evaluate decisions based on how they affect real people. I am interested in solutions, not the dysfunction of partisan politics. The Legislature has a responsibility to examine state programs and ensure outcomes, and to improve or end programs that no longer serve their purpose. Alaska has extraordinary opportunities. With a relentless focus on results, I believe we can build a stronger economy, safer communities, better schools, and an Alaska that continues to create opportunity for the next generation.
